SPRING

GARDENING

Communication, Language and Literacy (CLL)

New language: Blossom, bulbs, compost, bloom, roots, stem

Talk about the seasonal changes around us. Talk about our observations. Set up a garden centre role play area and take turns to be the costumer and shopkeeper.

Physical Development (PD)

Provide lots of opportunities for large, physical movement, e.g. building bridges with blocks, balancing equipment.

Provide physical activities which will support children's

friendships/cooperation skills. E.g. throwing, kicking balls to each other. Mud sensory tray with beans or seeds, garden tools, plant pots of transferring, filling and tipping, plant labels and marker pens, watering cans.

Take a walk to a garden to find new plants growing and blossom on the trees.

Puddle jumping

Work on the veg bed, plant seeds, dig over the soil, weed, watering with watering cans.

Expressive Art and Design

Roleplay taken from children's interests e.g. Garden centre roleplay Blossom pictures with tissue paper and twigs

Gather petals, daisies, leaves and grass and make a nature picture

Paint pebbles and decorate them like minibeasts

Garden themed messy play (cornflower, play dough)

Respond to music and make music – Rhythm and Rhyme session Add selection of world music to class collection.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

Look at the changes that are happening to the trees and compare to how they were at winter.

Have we changed since winter as well? Are we taller? Can we do new things?

Talk about new life, baby animals.

Focus on self-help skills: dressing, undressing, using toilet etc.

Encourage widening of friendships and supporting/modelling appropriate language in social situations.

Create and model responses how to ask to play, share etc.

Maths

Focus on numbers personal to children-Birthday chart, outdoor number line.

Encourage mark making of mathematical thinking.

Cooking opportunities to encourage comparisons of weight and amounts - more/less

Count and sort spring items like flowers, seeds, plant pots.

Compare sizes of plants and animals

Grow sunflower and measure and chart them.

Literacy

Gardening magazines

Spring words and picture cards

Matching letter sound to spring objects and playing the matching game, where I say a sound and show a letter card and they find an object that matches.

Plant seeds ready for the veg bed.

Draw pictures of your bean growing and label it.

Look for minibeasts and look them up in books or online
